- 500- to 1000-word statement of plan indicating precisely the purpose for which funding is sought (e.g., if for travel, the statement should provide a projected itinerary, a list of research facilities that will be visited, and an explanation of why those facilities need to be visited). If travel is involved an estimated budget is also required.
