### **P/N info and workflow form:**

You should ONLY complete the online workflow form if you did not submit the change previously in MyUI or if you want to change your P/N courses choices. If you are not sure of your grading selections, you can check them in MyUI BEFORE submitting the workflow form.

You may view your P/N Grading Option elections in MyUI at <https://myui.uiowa.edu/my-ui/student/records/registrar/covid-19-pass-fail.page>.

If, after checking the status of your Spring 2020 P/N Grading Option Election in [MyUI](#), you want to change to P/N or revert to a letter grade, do so using this online form for CLAS students: <https://workflow.uiowa.edu/entry/new/9802>. The deadline for students who have submitted a spring 2020 degree application is **Tuesday, May 26, 2020**. The deadline for all other students is **Friday, June 5, 2020**. If your primary major is in another College, you must contact that College for the late P/N request procedure.

### **Cares Act Emergency Fund**

Financial Aid also asks that we remind students about the Cares Act Emergency Fund. Students must have the FAFSA filled out to qualify, but they can fill it out now if they didn't already. They must also be enrolled. If a student withdrew from the semester at any time, the student is no longer eligible for the funding. Information about the fund is on their website. The application for the student is in MyUI.

### **Art History Internship**

The Museums of Story City has a summer internship available to assist with our World War Two research and online exhibit. Over 350 people from Story City served during WWII. We are in the process of compiling information for each one of those that served, including photos, draft cards, military records, newspaper articles, and letters. Internship duties will include scanning documents and photos, researching in online databases, and creation of an online exhibit on the Museum's website. Previous work with Weebly website builder is a plus but not necessary. A majority of the work can be done remotely, computer and internet access required. The internship will be 100 hours of work at a \$10 per hour rate for a total of \$1,000. ## **Summer Registration and courses. Drops, withdrawals and prices:**

Just as a reminder, if you only have one summer course listed on your schedule, and you want to drop it, this is called a withdrawal and not a drop. If you have more than one class, you can drop it, as long as one remains on your schedule.

**May 19** is the first day of summer classes and students who withdraw from the 4 wk, first 6wk and 12 wk sessions will owe 10% tuition and fees starting on that day.
