

Welcome to the School of Art and Art History (SAAH)- Tips for Transfers

- Is all of your college coursework showing on your degree audit? Students must report all post-secondary work to the UI. *To have transcripts sent* to Iowa contact your former colleges' registrar offices.
- Do you want to have a portfolio review to see if any of your art courses taken at a college will transfer in to meet requirements of the major? If so, portfolio reviews are held the Friday before the semester begins. Information can be found on the SAAH website- undergraduates- transfers. Contact lynne-lanning@uiowa.edu to set up your portfolio review time.
- If applicable, remember to contact your second major advisor before the semester begins.
- Is your health form in to Student Health? Failure to complete the health form will result in delayed registration next semester.
- Remember to complete the College Expectations course (0 s.h. and accessed through ICON) by the deadline!
- You will be receiving an eArt Advising newsletter every 2-3 weeks with information about deadlines, info sessions, honors, student activities and more that is related to your Studio Art and/or Art History major. Please read the information.
- You can access the eArt Advising and the list of info sessions from the School of Art and Art History (SAAH) webpage; resources-for students www.art.uiowa.edu/ljresources please make it a priority to attend info sessions.
- Spend some time on the department website

- If you wish to change your course schedule prior to the start of the semester:
 - ï To change *sections* of a course already on your schedule log onto myUI, click "registration" then click "change section" to the right of the enrolled course to see available sections. There is no need to contact an advisor if you are simply changing a section for a different time.
 - ï To change the courses you are enrolled in, please email one of the academic advisors to discuss the changes and any possible effects to your overall plan of study. International students need permission of ISSS to drop courses.
- Adding and dropping courses after the semester begins:
 - ï You may make changes to your schedule using your myUI account through the first week of classes. Please discuss any course changes with your academic advisor either Lynne or Megan.
 - ï *You can see both advisors, even though only one name appears on your degree audit.*
 - ï After the first week of classes you can drop courses online through your MyUI change of registration. You must send an email to the advisors as they do not get automatic notification you have sent a drop request. Adding a course will require a hard copy form. Instructors need to sign the add forms first, before the advisor. International students need ISSS permission to drop courses.
- How and when to contact your advisor:
 - ï You may contact us by phone or email whenever you have a question related to your student status.
 - ï You can set up advising appointment online from your MyUI account or send us an email to set up a time.
 - ï Most importantly, you are never bothering us. We prefer to meet with you as frequently as possible so that you get to know the resources at the University of Iowa and in the SAAH and enjoy the richness of the opportunities they provide. Please set an appointment with Lynne or Megan by the end of the second week of classes to check in.

8. **SAAH ADVISORS-** Even though you will have the name of Lynne or Megan as your advisor, you can see either. You will also have the name of a faculty member as an advisor. The faculty member is available for information

about a career, Megan and Lynne help with courses, academic plans, study abroad, honors and more. You can set up advising appointments from your MyUI or email either of them for an appointment.

9. BA and BFA degrees. Make an appointment with Lynne or Megan to discuss the difference between the two degrees, and plan how to meet your career and academic objectives. It is also important to meet with them if you are planning on completing a double major or incorporating Art Ed, minors or certificates into your academic objectives.

11. TERMINOLOGY of SAAH:

- a. **DISCIPLINES:** We have 10 disciplines in 3D and 2D. The 3D disciplines are: jewelry/metals, sculpture, ceramics, 3D Design and Intermedia. We have 5 in 2D: graphic design, printmaking, photography, drawing and painting. Animation is not a full discipline, but you can use the intro course to satisfy a requirement of the major. You can get a BFA in a DISCIPLINE, if selected to the BFA track through the clearance process.
- b. **AREAS:** There are four areas that all the disciplines fall under. 1. Painting/Drawing area- Painting and Drawing. 2. Printmaking- printmaking. 3. MSPD (Media, Social Practices and Design)- Graphic Design, Photography, Intermedia, Animation 4. Dimensional Practice- 3D Design, Jewelry/metals, Clay, Sculpture.

12. ELEMENTS COURSES- These are only for non-majors.

13. **SCHOLARSHIPS-** There are university scholarships and internships that you need to look for under the University and CLAS websites. The SAAH Scholarships are due on Feb. 1 for the following academic year and can be found at: <http://www.art.uiowa.edu/undergraduate-program>.

17. **HONORS-** Your final semester senior year, if you have a UJ GPA of at least 3.33 and a major GPA of at least 3.5, you are eligible to graduate with Honors in the Major, your final semester. 18. **DEGREE AUDIT:** It is critical to understand your degree audit. You are solely responsible for completing the requirements of your degree. Your degree is very important in helping you do that. Your advisors will review your degree audit with you when you meet with them. It is not mandatory meeting with advisors, so you need to initiate making the appointment. You can sign up for advising appointments on myUI or email them with a request to meet.
